NOTICE OF HEARING

TO ALL INTERESTED PARTIES AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On October 19, 1981, the Commission issued Order No. 232-23, which among other things, established 320-acre drilling and spacing units for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the J Sand Formation underlying certain lands, and allowed up to two wells to be drilled within each 320-acre drilling and spacing unit. Section 5, Township 4 North, Range 64 West, 6th P.M. is subject to this Order for the J Sand Formation.

On December 19, 1983, the Commission issued Order No. 407-1 (amended March 29, 2000), which among other things, established 80-acre drilling and spacing units for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Codell Formation underlying certain lands with the unit to be designated by the operator drilling the first well in the quarter section. The permitted well shall be located in the center of either 40-acre tract within the unit with a tolerance of 200 feet in any direction. The operator shall have the option to drill an additional well on the undrilled 40-acre tract in each 80-acre drilling and spacing unit. Section 5, Township 4 North, Range 64 West, 6th P.M. is subject to this Order for the Codell Formation.

On February 19, 1992, the Commission issued Order No. 407-87 (amended August 20, 1993), which among other things, established 80-acre drilling and spacing units for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Codell and Niobrara Formations underlying certain lands, with the permitted well locations in accordance with the provisions of Order No. 407-1. Section 5, Township 4 North, Range 64 West, 6th P.M. is subject to this Order for the Codell and Niobrara Formations.

On April 27, 1998, the Commission adopted Rule 318A., which, among other things, allowed certain drilling locations to be utilized to drill or twin a well, deepen a well or recomplete a well and to commingle any or all of the Cretaceous Age Formations from the base of the Dakota Formation to the surface. Pursuant to Rule 318A.k., Rule 318A. supersedes all prior Commission drilling and spacing orders affecting well location and density requirements of Greater Wattenberg Area wells. Rule 318A.d. provides that an operator may allocate production to any drilling and spacing unit with respect to a particular Cretaceous Age Formation consistent with the provisions of Rule 318A. Section 5, Township 4 North, Range 64 West, 6th P.M. is subject to Rule 318A., for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the J Sand, Codell and Niobrara Formations.

On February 16, 2012, Noble Energy, Inc. ("Noble" or "Applicant"), by its attorneys, filed with the Commission pursuant to § 34-60-116 C.R.S., a verified application ("Application") for an order to: (1) pool all interests in an approximate 160-acre designated wellbore spacing unit for the below-described lands ("Application Lands"), for the development and operation of the Codell and Niobrara Formations ("WSU #1"); and (2) pool all interests in an approximate 320-acre designated wellbore spacing unit for the below-described lands ("Application Lands"), for the development and operation of the J Sand Formation ("WSU #2"), to accommodate the Burman C 05-17D Well (API No. 05-123-34340), effective as of the earlier of the date of the Application, or the date that any of the costs specified in C.R.S. § 34-60-116(7)(b)(II) were first incurred for the drilling of the well, and to subject any nonconsenting interests to the cost recovery provisions of C.R.S. § 34-60-116(7):

In accordance with Rule 509., any interested party desiring to protest the granting of the application or to intervene on the application should file with the Commission a written protest or intervention no later than April 2, 2012, briefly stating the basis of the protest or intervention. Such interested party shall, at the same time, serve a copy of the protest or intervention to the person filing the application. An original and 13 copies shall be filed with the Commission. Anyone who files a protest or intervention must be able to participate in a prehearing conference during the week of April 2, 2012. Pursuant to Rule 503.g., if a party who has received notice under Rule 503.b. wishes to receive further pleadings in the above-referenced matter, that party must file a protest or intervention in accordance with these rules. In accordance with the practices of the Commission, should no protests or interventions be filed in this matter by April 2, 2012, the Applicant may request that an administrative hearing be scheduled beginning April 2, 2012. In the alternative, pursuant to Rule 511., if the matter is uncontested, the applicant may request, and the Director may recommend approval on the basis of the merits of the verified application and the supporting exhibits.
