NOTICE OF HEARING

TO ALL INTERESTED PARTIES AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On April 27, 1988, the Commission adopted Rule 318A which, among other things, allowed certain drilling locations to be utilized to drill or twin a well, deepen a well or recomplete a well and to commingle any or all Cretaceous Age Formations from the base of the Dakota Formation to the surface. Rule 318A supersedes all prior Commission drilling and spacing orders affecting well location and density requirements of Greater Wattenberg Area wells. On December 5, 2005, Rule 318A was amended, among other things, to allow interior infill and boundary wells to be drilled and wellbore spacing units to be established. On August 8, 2011, Rule 318A was again amended, among other things, to address drilling of horizontal wells. Section 26, Township 3 North, Range 66 West, 6th P.M. is subject to Rule 318A for the Niobrara Formation.

On February 19, 1992, the Commission issued Order No. 407-87 (amended August 20, 1993) which, among other things, established 80-acre drilling and spacing units for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Codell and Niobrara Formations, with the permitted well locations in accordance with the provisions of Order No. 407-1. Section 26, Township 3 North, Range 66 West, 6th P.M. is subject to this Order for the Niobrara Formation.

On March 5, 2012, the Commission entered Order No. 407-561 which, among other things, pooled all interests in an approximate 320-acre designated wellbore spacing unit ("WSU #3") established for the E½ of Section 26, Township 3 North, Range 66 West, 6th P.M. to accommodate the Camp 37N-26HZ Well (API No. 05-123-34956) ("Well"). Section 26, Township 3 North, Range 66 West, 6th P.M. is subject to this Order for the Niobrara Formation.

On April 18, 2013, Kerr-McGee Oil & Gas Onshore LP ("Kerr-McGee" or "Applicant"), by its attorneys, filed with the Commission pursuant to §34-60-116 C.R.S., a verified application ("Application") for an order to vacate the approximate 320-acre designated wellbore spacing unit (WSU #3 for the Camp 37N-26HZ Well) established and pooled by Order No. 407-561 for the below-described lands ("Application Lands"):

Pursuant to said hearing in the above-entitled matter at the time and place aforesaid, or at any adjourned meeting, the Commission will enter such orders as it deems appropriate to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public and to prevent the waste of oil and gas, either or both, in the operations of said field, and to carry out the purposes of the statute.

In accordance with Rule 509., any interested party desiring to protest the granting of the application or to intervene on the application should file with the Commission a written protest or intervention no later than June 3, 2013, briefly stating the basis of the protest or intervention. Such interested party shall, at the same time, serve a copy of the protest or intervention to the person filing the application. One electronic, one original and two copies shall be filed with the Commission. Anyone who files a protest or intervention must be able to participate in a prehearing conference during the week of June 3, 2013. Pursuant to Rule 503.g., if a party who has received notice under Rule 503.b. wishes to receive further pleadings in the above-referenced matter, that party must file a protest or intervention in accordance with these rules. In accordance with the practices of the Commission, should no protests or interventions be filed in this matter by June 3, 2013, the Applicant may request that an administrative hearing be scheduled beginning June 3, 2013. In the alternative, pursuant to Rule 511., if the matter is uncontested, the applicant may request, and the Director may recommend approval on the basis of the merits of the verified application and the supporting exhibits.
