On January 19, 2017, ConocoPhillips Company (Operator No. 19160) ("Conoco" or "Applicant"), filed a verified application pursuant to §34-60-116, C.R.S. for an order to:

- 1) Vacate an approximate 2560-acre unconventional resource unit, established for the Application Lands by Order No. 535-614, for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Niobrara Formation; and
- 2) Vacate the 640-acre drilling and spacing unit established for Section 35, Township 4 South, Range 64 West, 6th P.M. by Order No. 535-145, for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Niobrara Formation.

- On January 23, 2012, the Commission entered Order No. 535-118 which established one approximate 640-acre drilling and spacing exploratory unit for Section 32, Township 4 South, Range 64 West, 6th P.M., for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Niobrara Formation.
- On March 5, 2012, the Commission entered Order No. 535-145 which established 14 approximate 640-acre drilling and spacing units for certain lands including Section 34, Township 4 South, Range 64 West, 6th P.M., for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Niobrara Formation.
- On January 7, 2013, the Commission entered Order No. 535-237 which approved up to two horizontal wells for the Niobrara Formation within an approximate 640-acre

exploratory drilling and spacing unit for Section 32, Township 4 South, Range 64 West, 6th P.M., for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Niobrara Formation.

- On May 6, 2013, the Commission entered Order No. 535-313 which established two
 approximate 640-acre drilling and spacing units including Section 33, Township 4
 South, Range 64 West, 6th P.M., and approved up to two horizontal wells within each
 unit, for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Niobrara
 Formation.
- On July 29, 2013, the Commission entered Order No. 535-393 which pooled all interests within an approximate 640-acre drilling and spacing unit established by Order No. 535-313 for Section 33, Township 4 South, Range 64 West, 6th P.M., for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Niobrara Formation.
- On December 15, 2014, the Commission entered Order No. 535-614 which, among
 other things, established an approximate 2560-acre unconventional resource unit for
 the Application Lands for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons
 from the Niobrara Formation and allowed an appropriate number of horizontal wells
 within the unit in order to efficiently and economically recover the oil, gas and
 associated hydrocarbons from the unconventional resource unit.
