On March 1, 2018, Bison Exploration, LLC (Operator No. 10646) ("Bison" or "Applicant") filed a verified application pursuant to §34-60-118, C.R.S., and Commission 400 Series Rules for an order to:

1) Establish an approximate 160-acre enhanced oil recovery unit for the J-Sand Formation to obtain enhanced oil production from the J-Sand Formation from the Cavanaugh #3 well (API No. 05-005-06523).

APPLICABLE RULES AND ORDERS

- Rule 318.a. of the Rules and Regulations of the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission requires that, on unspaced lands, wells drilled in excess of 2,500 feet in depth be located not less than 600 feet from any lease line, and located not less than 1,200 feet from any other producible or drilling oil or gas well when drilling to the same common source of supply.
- On December 20, 1982, the Commission entered Order No. 393-1, which established 160-acre drilling and spacing units for the production of oil, gas, and associated hydrocarbons from the J-Sand Formation underlying certain lands in the Chalice Field, Arapahoe County with each unit consisting of a governmental quarter section and the permitted well for each unit shall be located no closer than 600 feet from the unit boundaries and no closer than 2,400 feet from another well producing from the same formation.
- Rule 401 of the Rules and Regulations of the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission

provides that no person shall perform any enhanced recovery operations, cycling or recycling operations including the extraction and separation of liquid hydrocarbons from natural gas in connection therewith, or operations for the storage of gaseous or liquid hydrocarbons, nor shall any person carry on any other method of unit or cooperative development or operation of a field or a part of either, without having first obtained written authorization from the Commission to perform the aforementioned activities or operations.
