NOTICE OF HEARING

APPLICATION

On March 1, 2018, Crestone Peak Resources Operating LLC (Operator No. 10633) ("Crestone Peak" or "Applicant"), filed a verified application pursuant to §34-60-116, C.R.S., for an order to:

- 1) Establish an approximate 1,680-acre drilling and spacing unit for Sections 19 and 30 and the N½, N½N½S½, of Section 31, Township 1 North, Range 68 West, 6th P.M., Colorado, and approve up to 36 horizontal wells within the unit, for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Niobrara and Codell Formations.
- 2) Provide that the productive interval of any horizontal well shall be no closer than 460 feet from the northern, eastern and western boundaries of the unit (regardless of lease lines within the unit), no closer than 150 feet from the southern boundary of the unit (regardless of lease lines within the unit), and not less than 150 feet from the productive interval of another well within the unit, unless an exception is granted by the Director.
- 3) Approve up to two new well pads within the unit, or adjacent thereto, unless an exception is granted by the Director.
 - 4) Provide that all horizontal wells will be drilled in a north-south orientation.
- 5) Find that the approximate 1,680-acre drilling and spacing unit for the development of oil, gas, and associated hydrocarbons from the Codell and Niobrara Formations underlying the Application Lands will prevent waste, protect correlative rights, and maximize the efficient and economic production of the Niobrara and Codell Formations in the Application Lands.
- 6) For such other findings and orders as the Commission may deem proper or advisable in this matter.

- On April 27, 1998, the Commission adopted Rule 318A, the Greater Wattenberg Area, Special Well Location, Spacing and Unit Designation Rule. The Application Lands are within the Greater Wattenberg Area ("GWA") and thus are subject to Rule 318A.
- On October 31, 2017, the Commission entered Order No. 407-2209 which, among other things, established an approximate 1,000-acre drilling and spacing unit for Section 31: N½, N½N½S½, Section 32: N½, N½N½S½ and Section 33: NW¼, N½N½SW¼, Township 1 North, Range 68 West, 6th P.M., and approved a total of up to 12 horizontal wells within the unit, for the production of oil, gas, and associated hydrocarbons from the Niobrara and Codell Formations, providing that the productive interval of the wellbore shall be no closer than 150 feet from the productive interval of any other wellbore producing from the Niobrara and Codell Formations, and no closer than 460 feet from the northern, southern, and western unit boundaries and 150 feet from the eastern unit boundary, unless an exception is granted by the Director, providing that the wells will be drilled from no more than one well pad within the unit or at legal location on adjacent lands, unless an exception is granted by the Director, and further providing that all horizontal wells shall be drilled in an east-west orientation. Concurrent with the filing of Crestone's Application, Extraction Oil and Gas, Inc. will be filing an application for the April 20 - May 1, 2018 hearing to amend Order No. 407-2209 to remove any portion of Section 31, Township 1 North, Range 68 West, 6th P.M. from the drilling and spacing unit.
