December 9, 2011		Pipeline installed under St. Vrain river
September 17, 2013		Experienced 1000 year flood in Northern Colorado
Spring 2015		Experienced significant rain fall followed by snow runoff in Northern Colorado
June 24, 2015	AM	Varran equipment operator contacted fire department about possible gas leak?
June 24, 2015	10:15AM	Ivan Ansel was contacted by Anadarko about a gas leak at the St. Vrain river
June 24, 2015	10:20AM	Chris Hettinger was called and responded to location
June 24, 2015	10:25AM	Chris was unable to visually inspect pipeline due to WC Sheriff who had WCR 13 blocked off at WCR 28
June 24, 2015	10:30AM	Chris talked to Anadarko pumper and found Varran meter (upstream) was indicating low pressure (15 psi). Anadarko pumper had just shut in meter.
June 24, 2015	10:30AM	Chris then blocked in two rupture pin valves, River meter #1036 and candy cane valve next to Gould meter to completely isolate this section of pipeline.
June 24, 2015	10:50AM	Chris told Fire department the line was isolated. Fire department then went to the river to verify gas had stopped flowing (Fire department described it as 8-10' geysers)
June 24, 2015	12:51PM	Margie Caughlin reported to State of Colorado Public Utilities we had a pipeline leak since WCR 13 was closed
June 24, 2015	1:30PM	Sam Wood called Chris Canfield with COGCC to notify them of gas release
June 24, 2015	3:00PM	Sam Wood called CDPHE emergency spill reporting line to notify them of gas release into waters of the State within 24 hours of event
June 26, 2015	9:00AM	Sam Wood submitted initial form 19 to COGCC
July 2, 2015	3:40PM	Sam Wood submitted supplemental form 19 to COGCC
July 2, 2015	7:00AM	Investigation team was selected but due to still high water levels and pipeline still underwater, the investigation was put on hold
July 22, 2015	1:00PM	Pipe was removed from river by Black Eagle
July 27, 2015	7:00AM	Investigation was started
