Local Government & COGCC Local Governmental Designee Program

Established via rulemaking in 1992 and bolstered by the passage and implementation of Senate Bill 19-181 in early 2019 under the Polis Administration, COGCC's nationally unique Local Governmental Designee (LGD) Program offers participating local governments various rights, powers, access to information and notifications, and other COGCC rule-based opportunities for local governments.

The COGCC LGD Program is a prime example of Colorado's regulatory process that provides direct avenues for collaboration between local governments and COGCC in matters concerning oil and gas development.

Participation in the LGD Program allows a local government (County, Town or City, or Special District) the opportunity to designate a specific individual (their LGD) as their "point person" regarding oil and gas matters. The selection of the LGD is entirely up to the local government, not COGCC.

Participation in the program (or changes to a participating local government's previously submitted information) is attained by submittal of a COGCC Form 29. Access to the Form 29 (and instructions) are available [HERE](#).

COGCC improved the LGD participation registration process in 2020 by making submittal of the Form 29 an entirely online process via the COGCC website.

Our agency seeks to serve, solicit participation from, and maintain working relationships with all those having an interest in Colorado's oil and gas natural resources.






SB19-181

- Early 2019-enacted law that significantly revised oil and gas regulation in Colorado at the local and state levels.
- COGCC, stakeholders & parties now embarking on various SB19-181 required rulemakings (some completed); one CDPHE (AQCC) rulemaking completed.
- SB19 -181 required Colorado Oil & Gas Conservation Act to be amended – (see Appendix V of COGCC Rules).

SB19-181 Major Elements


- COGCC Mission changed from “fostering” to “regulating” industry while prioritizing public health, safety, and environment concerns.
- Enables local governments the option to have increased regulatory oversight of land use and option to adopt or modify their local land use permitting process as they relate to oil and gas facilities.
- Local governments may opt to “go first” in land use permitting process; or concurrently with COGCC, or after COGCC location permitting process.

- All SB-19-181 rulemakings have or will include a robust "informal" stakeholder process, followed by a "formal" rulemaking process
- Attaining party status is required to formally participate in rulemakings.




COGCC Staff & Commission Structure

Commissioners (COGCC)

- 1951: 5 members – All with oil O&G experience
- Pre-2008: 7 members – 5 with O&G experience
- 2008-early 2019: 9 members – 3 with O&G experience
 - Executive Directors of DNR and CDPHE
 - 7 Part-time volunteer citizens appointed by Governor
 - Represent broad constituencies by statute
- Early 2019 to present – As above, but less industry representation, per SB19-181
- 2020 – Per SB19-181, “Professional” Commission (5) to begin on July 1, 2020.

Commission's Current Role

- The Commission acts in quasi-legislative, quasi-judicial, and executive branch capacities during regular and Special (typically Rulemaking or Enforcement) Hearings.
- Commission:
 - Engages in rulemaking
 - Adjudicates disputes
 - Enforces violations

COGCC Staff Role

In alignment with SB19-181 and COGCC Mission, Director and staff carry out day-to-day administration of the Oil and Gas Conservation Act (the “Act”) and regulate oil and gas operations via enforcement of rules, permits, permit conditions of approval (COAs), Best Management Practices (BMPs), Orders, and Policies.



If Oil and Gas activity is planned in your area, you may see:

- Submittal of Form 2 and 2A applications to COGCC (Initiates public comment period once posted)
- Submittal of local permit government applications
- Operators or their representatives
- Test borings
- Maintenance activity on wells or other facilities
- Seismic Exploration (thumper trucks)
- Operator inquiry regarding local government "siting" requirements
- Operator request for local government consultation regarding "siting"
- Calls from "building unit" owners / mineral interest owners / citizens
- Mineral leasing activity / Spacing Unit Applications / Applications for Pooling Orders
- Increased activity at Clerk & Recorders Office
- Land representatives visiting or contacting surface or mineral owners
- Surveying / use of drones
- Pipeline planning, permitting, and installation
- None of the above, or some of the above

Two COGCC Permits still required before drilling is allowed

Form 2A - Oil and Gas Location Assessment (OGLA)

Form 2 - Application for Permit to Drill (APD)

- In addition to rule requirements, COGCC using “Objective Criteria” to further evaluate permit applications until SB19-181 rulemaking completed.
- Local permitting requirements (if present) must be followed, including timing requirements.
- Various local governments are enacting local land use permitting regulations. Some have modified their local rules, or are in process of doing so, or considering adopting or revising local rules.

COGCC Two-Permit Process to Drill

Application for Permit-to-Drill (APD, Form 2)

Provides information specific to a well and its construction.

- Surface & bottom hole location
- Casing & Cementing plans
- Right to construct
- API number issued once permitted
- Permit valid for 2 years upon approval

Some example API #s:

05-033-06115 or 05-103-07211

05 = State (Colorado)

033 = county (Dolores County) or 103 = county (Rio Blanco)

06115 = sequence or 07211 = sequence

Oil & Gas Location Assessment (OGLA, Form 2A)

Provides assessment of surface location (usually a well pad or a tank battery)

- Area of disturbance
- Distance to homes / setback designation
- Environmental review
- Hydrology
 - Groundwater
 - Surface water
- Inter-agency consultation
- A six-digit Location ID issued upon permit approval
- Permit valid for 3 years upon approval

Some example Locations ID are:
415299 or 434375 (both in Erie)



Public Participation - Commenting on Pending Form 2s and 2As

- LGD and the public have 20 days (minimum) to comment on any pending permit application (Form 2 or 2A) before COGCC. Comment periods typically can be extended upon request of LGD.
- Comments must be submitted during finite public comment period.
- Actionable comments are site or resource specific and address specific issues or concerns.

LGD (and public) comments can result in COGCC-enforceable Conditions of Approval (COAs) being added to a permit that go above and beyond COGCC rules.

LGD and CDPHE Consultation on Permit Applications

- An LGD may request CDPHE consultation on any Form 2A or Form 2 application if significant health or environmental concerns are anticipated. Per current Rule, an LGD must request CDPHE consultation within 14 days of "Posting" of permit application to COGCC website.
- If consultation is requested, CDPHE may provide recommendations to COGCC to address and minimize potential adverse impacts to public health, safety, welfare and the environment.

Local Government Opportunities

- Local Government may establish or change their local permitting requirements (Land Use Regulations)
- Be a "Party" to Commission Rulemaking; join others as a "Party"
- Propose new or amended rules to COGCC
- Request consultation with COGCC or CDPHE on pending permits
- Comment on pending permit applications / request comment period extensions
- Consult with Operator on location siting (Large Urban Mitigation Area Facilities - LUMAF)
- Request meeting with Operator for locations proposed within designated setback areas (Buffer Zone or Exception Zone)

Public Participation Examples

In Colorado, the public has the opportunity to:

- Comment via SB19-181 rulemaking portals
- Provide comment at “regular” Commission Hearings (general or docket-specific)
- Comment on pending well (APD) or oil and gas location (OGLA) permit applications (within finite comment period)
- File complaints with COGCC (online tool)
- Consult with Operator if they are a Building Unit owner within a designated Setback location (Buffer Zone or Exception Zone)
- Report oil and gas related health concerns to OGHIRP operated by (CDPHE)
- Propose rules to the Commission and or participate as a party in Commission Rulemaking; or participate informally
- Receive notices of upcoming Hearings and Rulemakings
- Utilize COGCC website to stay current on oil and gas matters and data
- Request information from the LGD or from LGL
- Participate in federal oil and gas planning via National Environmental Policy Act (for example, commenting on Draft EIS, RMPs, and other planning documents)

On Using the website...

- There are various ways to get at information; find what works for you!
- The COGCC website is interactive, so a user can “toggle” from link to link, or from a map to a document or other data, and back and (see a Scout Card, for example). Hyperlinks are in underlined blue.

Dashboard - Access to key COGIS subsets useful to LGDs and Stakeholders

Spills, Operator Changes (new!)

For most data sets, Dashboard output can be filtered by county, city or town.

Complaints

Any member of the public, may file a complaint with COGCC.
Not all complaints received fall within COGCC jurisdiction, and may be referred to other agency.


Can be filed online via [COMPLAINTS](#) link on COGCC homepage.

All complaints are investigated, typically by:

- Field Inspection Unit and/or
 - Environmental Specialists.

Complaints can result in:

- Enforcement protocol (NOAVs), warning letters, compliance deadlines, referrals to other entities, or finding of operations in compliance with COGCC rules and permit conditions.



Oil and Gas Health Information and Response Program

The public has the opportunity to contact the CDPHE in the event one believes they have health concerns related to oil and gas.
