APPLICATION

On November 16, 2017, Bison Exploration, LLC (Operator No. 10646) ("Bison" or "Applicant") filed a verified application pursuant to §34-60-116, C.R.S., for an order to:

- 1) Amend Order No. 535-249 to allow additional 14 wells, for a total of 16 horizontal wells, in an established 1,280-acre drilling and spacing unit for the production of oil, gas, and associated hydrocarbons from the Niobrara Formation.
- 2) Require the productive interval of the wellbore of each wellbore in the unit to be no closer than 460 feet from the unit boundary, and no closer than 150 feet from the productive interval of any other wellbore located in the Niobrara Formation.
- 3) Require that the wells be drilled from no more than two well pads located within the unit, without exception granted by the Director.

APPLICABLE RULES AND ORDERS

- Rule 318.a. of the Rules and Regulations of the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission requires that, on unspaced lands, wells drilled in excess of 2,500 feet in depth be located not less than 600 feet from any lease line, and located not less than 1,200 feet from any other producible or drilling oil or gas well when drilling to the same common source of supply.
- On January 7, 2013, the Commission entered Order No. 535-249, which established two approximate 1,280-acre drilling and spacing units, and approved up to two horizontal

wells in each unit, for the production of oil, gas, and associated hydrocarbons from the Niobrara Formation, with the treated interval of the wellbores to be located no closer than 600 feet from the boundaries of the proposed units, and not less than 460 feet from any other well or treated interval of a well producing from the Niobrara Formation, without exception being granted by the Director.

One electronic (cogcc.hearings_unit@state.co.us), one original and two copies shall be filed with the Commission. **Anyone who files a protest or intervention must be able to participate in a prehearing conference during the week of January 15, 2018, if requested.** Pursuant to Rule 511, if the matter is uncontested, it may be approved without a hearing.
