Dear Ms. Murphy,

Extraction Oil & Gas, Inc. (Extraction) hereby certifies that it has complied with Rule 306.e, which states that an Operator shall be available to meet with Building Unit Owners who received an OGLA Notice or a Buffer Zone Notice pursuant to Rule 305.c. and requested a meeting regarding the proposed oil and gas location. Extraction sent notices pursuant to Rule 305.c and received one request for more information. Extraction met with a nearby building unit owner. They had a few questions and concerns:

- 1) Will there be water trucks lined-up along CR72? No, Extraction will be piping all water to the location. Extraction explained that there will be some sand trucks during the fracking operations, but due to the SandBox technology, they will not be lined up like previous operations.
- 2) Is the oil going to be trucked out? No, there are existing pipelines in the area further reducing truck traffic at the location.
- 3) What will the final footprint look like? Extraction is currently working with the property owner/developer and his landscaping engineer to fit the theme of the new division coming in, but, at a minimum, there will be berms and trees surrounding the facility.
- 4) County Road 72 in this area is unsafe; the road hasn't been properly graded and is now too narrow to fit a semi-truck passing another vehicle. The building unit owners, as well as Extraction, plan to bring this issue up to local government as it is a safety concern.

Extraction respectfully requests that the Director approve the Maverick wells.
